



A subjective and philosophical reading of Homer's *Odyssey*, examining human identity: through the awareness of being mortal, risk and travel, the names we give ourselves, the use we make of language and recognition by others. The author uses the iconography of the Greek vases in the recently reopened Campana gallery to see how artists have taken up the *Odyssey* and tackled these themes, while at the same time drawing on other works from different eras and civilisations to present a reconstruction of this journey of resonance in space and time.

Barbara Cassin, philosopher and Hellenist, is a specialist in Greek philosophers and rhetoric. A research director at the National Centre for Scientific Research, she was elected to the French Academy in 2018. Her work focuses on sophistry, rhetoric, and their relationship with philosophy.

From the 19th century onwards, many women took up photography, which was still in its infancy. Present in every field right up to the present day, from art to journalism, fashion, science and advertising, they all too often come up against a lack of recognition and visibility.

Laure Adler puts them in the spotlight with a selection of her personal choices, bringing together pioneers, forgotten figures and young discoveries. Some are involved in politics or feminist activism, others venture into war zones or break with norms and conventions. 



An exhaustive reference work on modern art in Scandinavian countries. The term "Scandinavian" here brings together the five Nordic neighbours with their different languages and cultures: Denmark, Finland, Iceland, Norway and Sweden. Of their modern art, we only really know a few famous artists and an aesthetic where originality and continuity of tradition are intertwined.

This extensively illustrated history from Impressionism up to the 1950s leaves plenty of room for the discovery of surprising and prodigious artists whose common trait is that unique Nordic light, such as Anders Zorn and Hilma af Klimt, Vilhelm Hammershøi and Franciska Clausen, Edvard Munch and Harriet Backer, Akseli Gallen-Kallela and Fanny Churberg, Finnur Jónsson and Öyvind Fahlström.


In this book, Serge Fauchereau also shows the extent to which women artists have been present for a long time in these countries, where women's rights were defended very early on.



After teaching American Literature at New-York University and Texas, **Serge Fauchereau** worked for ten years at the Pompidou Center as a curator of major exhibitions (Paris-New York, Paris-Berlin, Paris-Moscou, Les Réalismes, etc.). He has published over twenty works including a dozen monographs such as: Braque, Jean Arp, Kupka, Malevitch, etc. His works published with Flammarion include *Avant-gardes du XXe siècle* (2010), *Le Cubisme* (2012), *Les Peintres Mexicains* 1910-1960 (2013) and *L'Art des pays baltes* (2021)

Books are increasingly tackling the "gender" stereotypes in art history, emphasizing the "male gaze" in the depiction of women. In contrast, the "female gaze" theory, which emerged in the mid-1970s with feminist art history, remains underexplored, especially regarding how female artists portray the nude.

Historically, women lacked access to nude classes and were hesitant to participate. But perhaps the real issue is our collective inability to see the nude through women's eyes.

This project will dive into this uncharted territory, spanning four centuries with chronological chapters (featuring artists born from 1575 to 1975). Each chapter will unveil a "syndrome", an anthropological/psychoanalytical barrier explaining why we've overlooked nudes by women.


Key among these is the "Picasso syndrome", highlighting our fixation on the "male gaze" and dominated female nudes, while neglecting nudes by women, who may be portrayed as dominant and desiring. This work aims to flip the script on art history and open our eyes to the female gaze.

Paul Durand-Ruel redefined the role of the art dealer and became a precursor of the international art market scene, establishing a network of galleries between Paris, London, Brussels, and New York, and organizing international traveling exhibitions.

This extraordinary memoir of a visionary art dealer chronicles the emergence of the Impressionists and their controversial rise to success. First published in 1939, Paul Durand-Ruel's work is here supplemented with contemporary and historical information. Tracking his career as a patron and promoter of poverty stricken and struggling impressionist artists of the fin-de-siècle period, it provides a rare and invaluable first-hand account of the life and times of the Impressionists. The young collector and gallery owner supported them emotionally and financially, and relentlessly promoted works by the likes of Degas, Manet, and Millet – works now considered invaluable.

The memoirs delve into the records of his momentous career, using detailed accounts of auctions to reflect society's changing opinion and increasing adoration of the impressionist artists that Durand-Ruel had championed.

Flavie Durand-Ruel is the great-great-great granddaughter of Paul Durand-Ruel. She is an historian of art, specialized on the artists and art dealers of the 19th and 20th centuries. She has worked for 12 years for Christie's before dedicating herself to archives on Impressionists.



A must for all art students and the art amateurs alike. Observation and interpretation have been the fundamental guidelines of Daniel Arasse's teaching and of his works: looking closely at a detail in a painting and analyzing it is, according to him, a good way of approaching art.

In this respect, this work is a complete introductory lesson into how to look at a painting, and how to "read" paintings. The detail – whether it catches the viewer unawares, or is little by little discovered, identified, scrutinized, isolated, even cut out of its context – offers an entirely different way of seeing and apprehending painting.

In this work, the author goes beyond a simple history of the detail in art; he makes a whole reappraisal of the history of painting with the detail as his yardstick. With this original close-up examination of the practices of the paintbrush and the gaze, Arasse opened up a new field of study, challenging the categories of art history which seemed, after his analysis, to have been established "from afar", without taking into account the visual pleasure of the detail. A seminal work that has influenced many art historians and gives the general public new keys to look at paintings and understand art.

Daniel Arasse is a renowned art historian and a specialist of French Renaissance and Italian art, the author of numerous works on the history of art, including works on the major painters of the *Renaissance - Leonard de Vinci* (Hazan, 1997), *Boticelli* (Skira, 2004) and *Raphaël* (Skira, 2001; Liana Levi, 2003). His works include major reference studies on painting, such as *Le Sujet dans le tableau*, also published by Flammarion (1997, 2006).

Half a century after Pasolini's death, his legacy still pervades the diverse creative fields in which he worked; he remains a source of inspiration for filmmakers today.

Pier Paolo Pasolini was an intellectual with a painfully lucid view of his time, acutely aware of the rise of consumerist society. Although Pasolini considered himself primarily as a writer, he was best known through his film repertoire. Cinema provided a sounding board for his political ideas, which also played a central role in his written work. Pasolini's pluralistic approach combined poems, novels, essays, political statements, and films to create a cohesive message.


This book, and the exhibition it accompanies, demonstrates how the aesthetics of the writer-director's films were developed and influenced through the prism of classical and contemporary art, with clips from Accattone, Théorème, Salò, and other films juxtaposed alongside paintings by Pontormo, Pieter Claesz, Giorgio Morandi, Fernand Léger, and Francis Bacon. It retraces Pasolini's formative years studying art history at the University of Bologna under the guidance of Roberto Longhi, who held a lasting influence on Pasolini's taste. In his films, Pasolini reappropriated classical paintings in three ways: reproducing them as "living paintings" (The Deposition of Pontormo in La Ricotta); referencing them by reworking their composition or evoking striking details (Caravaggio's Sick Young Bacchus in Accatone); or including them on set (Juan Gris's Nature morte devant une fenêtre ouverte in Salo). To complete the book, works by thirty contemporary artists such as John Waters, Jenny Holzer, William Kentridge, Tom Burr, Marlene Dumas, Cerith Wyn Evans, Ernest Pignon-Ernest, Giovanni Fontana, and more demonstrate Pasolini's lasting influence on the art world.

Guillaume de Sardes is an art historian, writer, essayist, photographer and curator. Editor-in-chief of the magazine *Le Monde de l'art* in the past, he now runs the art magazine *Prussian Blue* and the bilingual online magazine *art-critique.com*. He is also a member of the committee of the Centre de la photographie Genève and responsible for the development of the Nouveau Musée National de Monaco.

With just eleven films to his credit, Michael Mann has managed to draw a singular and innovative line within the Hollywood industry. *Heat, Revelations, Ali, Collateral, Miami Vice*, and *Public Enemies* have reshuffled the cards of American cinema to the point of making Mann one of the most important filmmakers of the last three decades.
