
Glaciers occupy a vast part of the emerged lands in Antartica, the Arctic and the mountains of the planet. They depend on climatic conditions (temperatures and snow precipitations) for their development, and the contemporary climate changes threaten their survival. In the more or less recent past of the Earth, the glaciers have also occupied huge spaces, sculpting spectacular landscapes (fjords, valleys, glacial cirques). Landscaping, patrimonial, esthetic stakes, reinforce the attraction that these glaciers have on men. Around 5 parts, the atlas goes over definitions, the links between glaciers and climates, the current melting, the disappeared glaciers and the links between men and glaciers.

**Denis Mercier** is a physical geography professor at the Paris IV-Sorbonne university. He is specialised in glacial landforms and cold regions. He is the author and coordinator of several works on physical geography and geomorphology.
